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The Conference

The International Conference on Treatment of Addictive Behaviors (ICTAB) began in 1979, communicating recent therapeutic methods and research knowledge to professionals working with the addictive behaviors. Committed to the integration of science and practice, ICTAB brings together international professionals from a variety of disciplines. An enduring focus of ICTAB is on commonalities in the etiology, process, and treatment of alcohol/drug abuse and other addictive behaviors. Previous ICTABs have been held in Australia, The Netherlands, Norway, Scotland, South Africa, and the United States.

ICTAB-10 is co-sponsored by the Center on Alcoholism, Substance Abuse, and Addictions (CASAA) of the University of New Mexico, and the German Society of Addiction Psychology. ICTAB-10 will focus on the theme: ***From Research to Practice and Back Again***. Rather than conceptualizing dissemination as one-way transmission from research to practice, the conference will explore ways in which clinical and research professionals can interact to improve the treatment of addictive behaviors. As in previous ICTABs, three different types of presentations will be featured:

Invited addresses will be given by prominent researchers in the addictive behaviors. These presentations will provide an overview of research pertinent to particular pieces of the puzzle.

Contributed presentations will describe specific research in a broad range of areas related to the nature and treatment of addictive behaviors. These will include selected symposia as well as poster sessions that allow personal interaction with presenters.

Practitioner workshops will teach clinical intervention and research methods based on recent research findings.

The Location

The German city of “*Heidelberch*” on the Neckar River, known today as Heidelberg, dates to 1196. Despite massive destruction from wars and from fires caused by lightning strikes, ancient Heidelberg Castle still stands at the heart of Old Town. A high point of any visit to Heidelberg is a tour of the castle ruins where you find the *Grasser Fass* (huge wine barrel), the German Apothecaries Museum, and beautiful castle gardens. Spectacular views of the castle, illuminated by night, are seen from the north on the Neckar River.

Between the castle and the Neckar is the *Alte Universität*, one of the world’s oldest universities, founded in the 13th century. Through the centuries Heidelberg has been famous for its philosophers, theologians, psychiatrists, poets, and other scholars. Today the main square in front of the University remains Heidelberg’s gathering place for students, street musicians, and visitors from all over the world.

Just east of Old Town overlooking the Neckar River is the ICTAB-10 conference site, the ***Heidelberg Marriott Hotel***. Those arriving by air into Frankfurt airport can travel the one hour to Heidelberg through beautiful countryside by car, train, or shuttle (TLS Airport Shuttle Service: <http://www.tls-heidelberg.de>).

General Information

Early Registration is Advised Because of hotel capacity, ICTAB registration is limited to 220 participants. *Prior ICTABs have been fully enrolled and closed.* To guarantee your attendance, your registration must be received no later than **July 1, 2003**. The community reinforcement approach (CRA) is an evidence-based cognitive-behavioral method for treating alcohol/drug problems. This workshop will provide an introduction to CRA practice and research, and to a CRA-based method for unilateral intervention through concerned family members.
- Workshop C:** *MULTISYSTEMATIC THERAPY (MST)*

Medical University of South Carolina, USA
Multisystemic therapy is an intensive family-based treatment that has achieved very high rates of treatment engagement and favorable long-term outcomes for substance abusing youth. This workshop will provide attendees with experience in MST clinical case analyses, intervention planning, and quality assurance procedures that have been instrumental in attaining such outcomes.

Call for Papers

Proposals are invited for contributed presentations at ICTAB-10. Submitted papers should be based on original research relevant to the nature, prevention, and treatment of addictive behaviors. Papers describing outcome research with treatment and prevention programs are particularly encouraged.

Abstracts may not exceed 500 words and should reflect the basic methodology and findings of the work to be presented. Research in progress may be submitted if informative new results will clearly be available by the time of the conference.

Most submitted papers will be scheduled for *poster sessions* rather than oral presentation. This permits simultaneous presentation of multiple papers through visual displays and enables presenters to converse with interested participants. Symposia or workshops may also be proposed, and will be accepted on a more limited basis.

Abstracts must be received no later than May 1, 2003. All presenters must register for the conference. No fee waiver is provided for presenters of contributed presentations. Abstracts will be reviewed, and notification of acceptance or nonacceptance will be sent by **June 1** (via email/fax). Abstracts may be sent by mail, or by e-mail (attachments in MS Word).
